This data is interrogated so that we can adjust our teaching to the needs of our students, particularly to those performing beyond or below the expected year level. Many thanks to our staff, with special mention to Mr Nick Ryan, Mrs Toni Benci and Mr Heaney, who have done an incredible amount of work in this area as the results speak for themselves.

#### **CESA Classroom Pulse Check In**

In recent weeks, all children from Reception to Year 6 completed the first of Catholic Education SA Classroom Pulse Check Ins. This survey occurs once each term and is an initiative to find out about how our students are currently feeling about their experiences at school. Questions that are asked relate to wellbeing, identity, learning, relationships and belonging. The data collected is state-wide, however as part of our commitment to know every learner in our school, the Leaders of Learning and Leadership team review the data and connect with students whose responses identify any potential social, emotional, and learning needs they may have and whether follow up conversations are required. ### Holy Week



### School zone rules / laws reminder

#### Student Safety

A reminder to all parents and caregivers to obey the school zone, crossing laws and parking signage rules near our school.

The city of Unley have constructed an amazing resource for the community regarding safety around School Zones and Crossings:

## **School Zones and Crossings**

#### **School Zones**

installed on most roads around schools - as shown by these signs. A zigzag white line is also usually marked on the road to let drivers know they are approaching a School Zor



Drivers must not exceed 25km/h at any time of the day or night when a child is in the zone. This includes children walking or riding a bicycle either on the road, footpath or

The lower speed limit applies whenever children are in the zone, including weekends and school holidays.

It makes sense to slow down as you approach a school at all times of the day and night to check if there are children in the area. Children can be present outside of normal school hours because of many activities that take place in the school.

#### **Emu Crossings**

An Emu Crossing has a red 'Children Crossing' flag displayed on red and white striped posts



crossing or about to cross the road

Emu crossings are located within School Zones, which have a speed lmit of 25km/h when children are on the road or footpath.

If the 'Children Crossing' flags are not up, the 25km/h school zone speed limit still applies if there are children present.

#### Koala Crossings

A Koala Crossing consists of two yellow flashing lights mounted on red and white striped poles.

Koala Crossings operate only when the yellow lights are flashing. A 25km/h speed limit applies between signs on the approaches to the crossing when the lights are flashing, and drivers must stop and give way to anyone using the crossing or about to cross the road.

School monitors may be present at the

crossings and it is important to obey the Stop signs used by the

#### **Wombat Crossings**

A Wombat Crossing consists of a wide road hump marked with thick white stipes.

A 40km/h speed limit applies metres of the crossing as shown on signs.

When a pedestrian is crossing or about to cross the road, drivers must stop and give way.

## Parking Signs



### No Stopping signs

You must not park or stop in a No Stopping



### No Parking signs

You can only stop in a No Parking area for the immediate purpose of picking up or dropping off passengers or goods. The driver must remain with the vehicle and take no more than

## **Parking Restrictions**

#### **Near school crossings**

Parking is generally banned at school or other pedestrian crossings for 20 metres before and 10 metres after the crossing, unless signs indicate otherwise.

It is important not to park near crossings as it can make it harder to see children and other pedestrians using the crossing.

#### **Double Parking**

It is illegal to 'double park by stopping next to another car already parked near the kerb. Double parking restricts access for other traffic and can block sight lines for children on the side



#### Parking across driveways

You should not park across a driveway. Restricting access to driveways is illegal and can inconvenience the property

### **Continuous Yellow Line**

A continuous yellow line marked on the edge of the road has the same meaning as a no stopping zone.

No parking allowed at any time if there is a



### **Parallel Parking**

Unless there are signs or markings on the road to indicate some other method, you must park parallel to the edge of the road and footpath.

- · Park your vehicle so that it is facing in the same direction as the moving traffic.
- Unless permitted by a parking sign, leave a minimum of  $\boldsymbol{3}$ metres between your vehicle and any continuous dividing

At SJMS we take student safety seriously. The incident this week where students from Marrayatville High School were injured is an unfortunate reminder that whilst all precautions are taken, accidents do still happen.

At William Street the school crossing is manned by staff between 8:15am and 8:45am every morning and 3pm – 3:30pm every afternoon. We all have a role to play in the safety of the students in our community and we ask parents and caregivers to remember the following:

- 1. If the school crossing at William Street is unsupervised, please supervise your child to cross the road.
- 2. Do not make U turns in front of the school.
- 3. Use your Yellow Name Sign at all times to help support us move children from the piazza to your car safely afterschool.

### At Bridge Street:

- 1. Use your Yellow Name Sign at all times to help support us move children from the school to your car safely afterschool.
- 2. When crossing the road, please hold your child's hand.
- 3. Do not park across driveways.

Any parent/caregiver who would like more information about the scheme can contact our school or phone the School Card Office on 1800 672 758 (free call).

For eligible families, St Joseph's Memorial School lower income fee will apply once School Card is approved. A credit is applied to your account to reflect the lower fee and a revised statement sent home for you.

### School Card Income Limits

To qualify for School Card, your family's gross income must be below a certain limit. This limit depends on how many dependent children you have. The tables below list the income limits for applications lodged in 2023 – this based on the family's gross income in 2021/2022.

Number of dependent children Combined gross family income limit for the 2021/22 financial year Gross weekly school card income limit.

1 child \$66.412 \$1.277

2 children \$67,598 \$1,300

3 children \$68,784 \$1,323

4 children \$69,970 \$1,346

5 children \$71,156 \$1,369

Each additional dependent child \$1,186 \$23


### What if I know exactly what I need?
