The staff and students have returned with renewed excitement about what the new school year will bring. The year ahead will be filled with many learning opportunities, community connecting events, and collaboration with the aim to live each day with our school motto, 'In All Things Love,' as our guide.

WEEK 0

Before the students returned, the school undertook professional learning that included working with Professor Anne Bayetto, a researcher and lecturer, on developing reading comprehension and fluency practices to improve student literacy development in the big 6 of reading, which are:

- Oral language
- Phonological awareness
- Letter-sound knowledge (phonics)
- Vocabulary

- Fluency
- Comprehension

At the end of last year, teachers undertook a curriculum professional development session with our eastern region Catholic Education advisor, Alison Hubner-Booth, on curriculum mapping, with a focus on Numeracy. This training helped staff to identify the scope and sequence of their teaching to ensure impactful learning attainment and achievement for their students.

On the Wednesday, we introduced the opportunity for students and families to 'Meet their Teacher' prior to school commencing in Term 1.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

This year we celebrated a large group of students in our Preschool, Ready for Reception and two Reception classes. Currently, across both campuses, we have over 220 students attending from Preschool to Year 6.



WELCOMING MASS



In relation to the required uniform for students to wear on the days we have a school Mass, currently we are happy for students to wear the uniform they would usually wear on the day of the Mass. The only Mass we require all students to wear a formal uniform for is the Year 6 Gradutation Mass at the end of the year.

ROAD AND TRAFFIC SCHOOL SAFETY

As we commence a new school year, it is important to share pivotal reminders with the community regarding optimising road safety for all members of our school.

I would like to remind our community to ensure that they park in suitable spaces marked with signage and be mindful of the speed limit going through school zones.

Here is some useful information provided by our local council to assist our community traffic awareness to optimise safety for all:



No Parking Zones

Australian Road Rule 168* A driver may only stop in a no parking zone for the purpose of picking up or dropping off passengers or goods. The driver must remain with the vehicle and take no more than two minutes.

The purpose of a no parking zone near to a school is to provide an area in which motorists can quickly pick up or drop off their children. For the zone to work effectively, it is important that motorists adhere to the restrictions. This helps to maximise use of the available on-street parking during the peak pick up and drop off times.



Koala crossings

A koala crossing consists of two yellow flashing lights mounted on red and white striped poles. Koala crossings operate only when the yellow lights are flashing. A 25km/h speed limit applies between signs on the approaches to the crossing when the lights are flashing. Drivers must stop and give way to anyone using the crossing or about to cross the road.

Parking Restrictions

Near school crossings

A driver must not stop on a school crossing. Parking is prohibited within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing, as it can obstruct the line of sight for pedestrians and make it difficult for motorists approaching a crossing.

Continuous yellow line

Australian Road Rule 169*

A continuous yellow line marked on the edge of a road has the same meaning as a 'no stopping' zone and provides greater safety near corners and driveways. A driver must not stop at the side of a road marked with a continuous yellow line.

Double parking

Australian Road Rule 189*

It is illegal to double park by stopping next to another vehicle already parked near the kerb. Double parking restricts access for other traffic and can block the line of sight for children and pedestrians on the side of the road

Parking across driveways

Australian Road Rule 198*

A driver must not obstruct driveway access by stopping on or across a driveway, as this can cause a significant inconvenience for residents, businesses or other motorists requiring access.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

As part of our commitment to fostering a safe, inclusive and healthy environment for all students, we kindly remind families not to send food or treats to school for birthday celebrations. Any such items brought to school will be sent back home.

This is in place to ensure:

- Safety for All: Many students have food allergies or dietary restrictions, and even minimal exposure to allergens can pose serious health risks.
- Equity and Inclusion: By avoiding food-based celebrations, we create a more inclusive environment where all students feel

equally valued, regardless of their family's circumstances.

We also want to emphasise that there is absolutely no expectation for families to provide anything for birthday celebrations. However, if you would like to acknowledge your child's special day, here are a few thoughtful, non-food suggestions:

- Donate a favourite or meaningful book to the classroom library.
- Arrange a fun class activity or game in coordination with the teacher.
- Provide small keepsakes like stickers, pencils, or bookmarks.

Once again, I wanted to sincerely thank the community for your trust and support. I am looking forward to seeing you around the school in the coming weeks and am committed to leading St Joseph's Memorial as a school of faith, learning, and community into a promising future.

- 1. A current Catholic Police Check (parents/caregivers attending excursions, reading in class, helping in class, attending community events);
- 2. A current Responding to Abuse and Neglect in Education and Care for Volunteers certificate (please click here to view how to complete this requirement);
- 3. Completed the volunteers application.

A Catholic Police Check for volunteers at SJMS are free for our current parents and caregivers. Application Forms are available to download here or at either school office.

We ask that you present your completed form with verification ID to the front office, and we will submit the application on your behalf. You will then receive an email link to complete the process online. Once all cleared you will receive a Catholic Police Check ID card in the post, please bring this in to the front office and we will take a copy of your clearance.

This process ensures we maintain a child safe environment. To avoid disappointment, we encourage you to apply for a Catholic Police Check through either school office as soon as possible.




Communication Flowchart
