Dear Parents and Caregivers

This Sunday at Mass we hear the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This is one of the most dramatic events in Mark's Gospel and reveals the true identity of Jesus.

The word 'transfigure' means to change or be transformed. In this event we read that Jesus' physical appearance changes, "His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them."

The disciples who are with Jesus, see before them two of the most important figures in Judaism - Moses and Elijah. Moses represents the law as God gave him the *Ten Commandments* on Mount Sinai and Elijah, regarded as the greatest prophet.

In the Transfiguration, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection as we have the benefit of knowing what is to come. His Disciples however, don't and as such, their confusion continues as they do not understand what Jesus means by his words below:

Mark 9 – 10: "As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. ¹⁰ They kept the matter to themselves, discussing what "rising from the dead" meant."

Meet Ronita from the Philippines. Ronita is a mother of two young boys living in a slum in Quezon City. She went back to school to finish

her education so that she could earn income to support her children.

Meet Leaia from Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water was very difficult for Leaia and her family. But, with the support of Caritas Australia, a water tank was installed at their home, improving their health and living conditions.



Meet **Memory** from Malawi. Memory, the eldest daughter from a rural Malawian family, trained to become a carpenter and is now a trailblazer for future generations of women in her village.

This year, we will focus our Fundraising efforts for Caritas in Week 8. Further information will be available shortly. Money raised during this week will go to supporting Caritas in their work with Ronita, Leaia, Memory and their communities.

- 3. Completed the volunteers application.

A Catholic Police Check for volunteers at SJMS are free for our current parents and caregivers. Application Forms are available to download here or at either school office.

We ask that you present your completed form with verification ID to the front office, and we will submit the application on your behalf. You will then receive an email link to complete the process online. Once all cleared you will receive a Catholic Police Check ID card in the post, please bring this in to the front office and we will take a copy of your clearance.

This process ensures we maintain a child safe environment. To avoid disappointment, we encourage you to apply for a Catholic Police Check through either school office as soon as possible.


